Process (refs)

1. Assignor emails the refs on Sunday for next Sat (LDT/IH) and Sun (Travel) games
2. Refs to confirm by Monday to ref assignor;
3. Ref Assignor to confirm with travel/LDT coaches , IH director and age group coordinators by Wednesday;
4. Refs to contact coaches by Thursday;
5. Coaches to communicate any game changes to Refs & Assignor by Fri 10 AM.
6. Refs to arrive 15 mins before the games unless there are back to back games;
7. Refs are to be paid on the field after competing the games via their age group coordinators - based on the scheduled games;

IH Game Cancellation Policy

1. All games are cancelled if the Fields are closed – web-site, hotline (845-223-2840) updated, cancellation.com informed.
2. If fields are open but the weather is bad, IH Director makes the call if IH games are cancelled or not – If the games are cancelled, IH director informs the Age group directors who will communicate with the coaches & assigned refs. Hotline updated
3. Games canceled on the field by the ref (lightning, dangerous field conditions, forfeit, unruly behavior) are paid
4. Games canceled due to rain or snow require 2 hours prior notice - if less, referee is paid
5. Games canceled for other administrative reasons require 48 hours prior notice or the referee should be paid.
6. Assigned refs and ARs need to inform the host coach of their assignments through coach's preferred & documented method of communication, i.e. emails or phone-calls, at least 3 days before the game . If a referee has not notified the home coach of his/her assignment prior to the cancelled game, no payment will be made to that referee.

2. All players must be registered in order to play, **no registration – no play.**

4. All players of a given team should be wearing shirts of the same color (team shirts are provided to all registered players).
5. Field size is 40 yards wide by 60 yards long.
6. Number 4 size ball.
7. Roster size is a maximum of 14.
8. Number of players on the field for each team is 8 vs 8 including the goalie.
9. Each game will have a referee assigned. In the case a referee does not show up for the game, the following applies:
 - a. Before the start of the game, one coach or parent should be assigned to keep time.
 - b. There should be only one referee on the field during a game, and no coaches on the field during the game.
 - c. Referee is to be a parent or coach from one team for one half and a parent or coach from the other team for the second half. The referee is to have at least a basic understanding of the rules of soccer and these rules.
10. Referee calls stand and are not to be disputed.
11. A parent from each team should be assigned to assist the referee with side line calls. The referee's calls supercede any side line calls and the referee's calls are the final and undisputed calls.
12. To begin each game, a coin toss determines the opening kick off. The winner gets choice of ball or goal to defend. Teams alternate kick offs at each quarter.
13. Length of each game is four 12 1/2 minute quarters (50 minute game). There should be a 2 minute break between the 1st and 2nd and the 3rd and 4th quarters, and a 5 minute break at the half.
14. There are no "time-outs" unless the referee stops play for an injury.
15. Kick off occurs at the beginning of each quarter, the half, and after each goal.
16. Kick off is from the center mark of the field and must be passed forward and cannot be touched by that player until another player has touched the ball. A goal cannot be scored directly off a kick off.
17. Substitution is allowed only with permission of the referee during stoppages of play according to FIFA rules.
18. Ball is out of play when the entire ball has crossed over a side or end line.
19. When the ball goes out of play on a side line, it shall be thrown in from the point where it crossed the line. The thrower must face the field and shall deliver the ball with both feet on the ground, behind the line, with two hands on the ball from behind and over their head.
20. When the offensive team kicks the ball over the opposing teams end line, the opposing team shall take a goal kick. The ball must be placed on the ground and the kick taken from any place within the goal box area.

25. For any other stoppages of play other than a goal or a ball leaving the field of play (for example an injury), a dropped ball shall be made between one player from each team. The ball must hit the ground before either player can make a play on the ball.
